



FREQUENTLY ASKED BLOCK PARTY QUESTIONS

Can We Close Our Street for a Block Party?

- Yes, many local streets can be closed when residents are in agreement and access for the rest of the neighborhood is not blocked.

Which Streets can be Closed for a Block Party and How Late can I have a Block Party?

- Local streets and non-emergency streets can be blocked off, while arterial and collector streets **CANNOT** be blocked off. **All block parties must be concluded by 11:00 p.m.**

How Much Does it Cost?

- There is no charge for a block party.

What is the Deadline to Submit the Block Party Application, Indemnity Agreement and Petition?

- Block Party Applications need City Council approval. The Council meets the 1st and 3rd Mondays of the month. The Application must be received prior to the Thursday before the Council meetings.

How Many Signatures do I Need to Obtain?

- You must notify and obtain signatures from residents of all households living along both sides of the street that you want to block off.

Does the City Provide the Barricades to Block the Street?

- Yes, the Clear Lake Police Department provides the barricades at no cost on a first-come basis.. It is the responsibility of the Party Organizer to pick up the barricades at the Police Station and to return them the following day. You will also need one "Street Closed" sign on each end of the street, placed on one of the barricades.

Are Alcoholic Beverages Permitted?

- Yes, as long as it is controlled by the adults. Moderate consumption can be permitted, however, excessive use can ruin the Block party atmosphere, as well as send a wrong message to the underage attendees. Drink Responsibly!
