

MINUTES
OF A WORKSESSION
OF THE CLEAR LAKE CITY COUNCIL

The Clear Lake City Council met in a worksession pursuant to law and rules of said Council on Monday, June 3, 2013, at 6:00 p.m., at City Hall, with Mayor Nelson P. Crabb presiding. All Council Members present.

Boehnke moved to approve the agenda, seconded by Callanan. Roll Call: Passed Unanimously.

Deb Kern, 815 N 40th Street, representing the “Patriots for Pets Rescue and Shelter”, reviewed her plans to develop a new pet shelter in Clear Lake. She stated that she believes there is currently an overpopulation of animals in the area and that the humane society in Mason City is unable to accommodate the overpopulation. Kern advised that she would be soliciting donations throughout the community for start up and building costs and asked that the Council consider assisting the shelter financially. Mayor Crabb advised that City staff would follow up with her regarding her request.

Council Member Unsworth stated that he has been approached by several residents whom reside near the 14th Ave S. public approach regarding the general disrepair of the approach and asked that the Council consider options to improve the area. Randy Miller, Park & Recreation Director, stated that the P&R Board had previously discussed paving a 10 foot wide lane with sod on either side of the paved area. After general discussion, the Council directed Miller to work with City Administrator, Scott Flory to bring options regarding improvements to the 14th Ave S Public Approach to the Council at a future meeting.

There being no further business before the Council, Boehnke moved to adjourn at 6:28 p.m., seconded by Unsworth. Passed Unanimously.
